

Sexual Health Care for Adolescents

Sexual health screenings for sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and cervical cancer helps teens and young adults stay healthy. STIs can lead to short-term health issues like urinary tract infections and long-term health issues like infertility, cervical cancer, human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), and even death. STI rates, particularly for Chlamydia and Gonorrhea, continue to rise in the state of Texas. It is strongly encouraged to get sexual health screenings beginning at the age of 16, especially if you are sexually active. The best options for ruling out

Talk to your child's doctor if you have any questions or concerns about STIs.



Don't risk your family's health! (It could be costly.)

Taking your teen to their annual checkups is important to make sure they are growing healthy and to avoid future health problems.

As your teen continues to grow, their health needs will also change and it's important they stay covered. Health care can sometimes be costly, and the best way to prepare for the unexpected is by renewing your teen's Medicaid coverage each year.

Make sure to act quickly when you receive your renewal packet from Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC). It's better to be prepared—we don't want you to be caught off guard by increased health costs if you forget to renew your coverage.
